For the implementation of the workshops throughout Cyprus, a group of 20 mentors was formed. Trainers as well as educators were selected through an open call. The response to the invitation was immediate and large in numbers. Potential participants were informed about the project and their potential involvement.


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
TRAINING MANUALS AND HANDBOOKS
